Quest Activity:

- There are numerous alternative education models that have be implemented throughout the world. While some of these diverse models might be more familiar, the Waldorf educational philosophy for example, others such as anarcho-pedagogy are more unconventional and operate on the fringes of the education system. In this quest, you will be exposed to the Free School model and will be asked to examine whether and how elements of this model might be applied to the public school system.

Topic: Free Schools, by Patrick McDowall.



Decades of research has shown that all children develop at varying paces. Rousseau, Gessel, and Werner all highlighted this fact and saw little benefit in pushing learners towards concepts they are not yet developmentally prepared for, and yet this is the precise framework implemented in public schools. The dissatisfaction and trauma experienced by those learners

unable to adapt to the public school model has led to the creation of alternative systems. While home education and deschooling have seen a dramatic increase in popularity, various models of community schooling have also been developed. One such example is the so-called Free School where democratic values and individualization are seen as paramount. In a Free School there is no curriculum and the learner directs their own progress towards self-appointed goals. The teacher is present but always remains in the role of facilitator. While still quite heterodox, Free Schools are slowing moving in from the margins and are garnering increased attention.

- What do you consider are the barriers to any possible application of these ideas to the public school system?
